When did the SEMMSF start?

It started in 2007 when the community lost a New Bedford Firefighter, Brian Mello, a wife lost her husband and a family lost a father in a tragic motorcycle crash.



Who is the SEMMSF?

The Southeastern Massachusetts Motorcyclists' Survivors Fund, Inc. (SEMMSF) is a 501 (c) (3) non-profit, all volunteer organization that raise funds to help families of riders killed or seriously injured in motorcycle accidents.

What is the SEMMSF?

We are a survivors fund that relies on donations from events, fundraisers, people and businesses to build a fund that is used to help with household bills that are usually hard to pay when the motorcyclists is injured and or killed in a motorcycle accident. The monies may also be used to help promote motorcycle safety and awareness.



Where is the SEMMSF?

The Organization covers 98 cities and towns in Barnstable, Bristol, Dukes, Nantucket, Norfolk and Plymouth Counties.

How does the SEMMSF work?

The SEMMSF accepts applications for assistance from the families of motorcyclists that have been killed or seriously injured in motorcycle accidents. Each application is reviewed by the Board of Directors (BOD), and a call is made to schedule an appointment with the applicant. After the meeting, the BOD sits down, goes over the information obtained from the meeting, our financial records and decides on how much assistance the SEMMSF can provide.

Our Annual Brian's Ride is what we rely on to raise monies for the fund. The dates vary, but Brian's Ride is usually held the Sunday closest to the first of August.
